Upcoming Elections

Since January 2016, you have been hearing about our upcoming election of officers in May 2016. To date, we are still looking for a Chairperson of the Board of Communications and President of GSLC congregation. Marlis Norton and Becky Aragon have been relentless in filling the ballot for all the open positions and are now counting on the Spirit to move members of the congregation to consent to having their name on the ballot for these spots. I would like to remind everyone about the process of electing people to the various offices as per the GSLC Constitution as follows:

"Officers of the congregation, board chairpersons and elders must be communicant members 18 years of age or older. All terms of office shall be two years. Consecutive terms in an office shall be limited to two. The office of President, Treasurer, Chairperson of the Board of Christian Education, Chairperson of the Board of Christian Ministry – Outreach, the Chairperson of the Board of Communication, the Chairperson of the Board of Stewardship and approximately half of the Elders will be elected in the second quarter of even numbered years, taking office on July 1.

The office of Vice President, Secretary, Financial Secretary, the Chairman of the Board of Elders (Head Elder), the Chairperson of the Board of Property, the Chairperson of the Board of Christian Ministry - Inreach and approximately half the Elders will be elected in the second quarter of odd numbered years, taking office on July 1.

The Church Council shall appoint and announce the members of the Nominating Committee at least two months prior to the election of officers and chairpersons. The committee shall nominate at least one candidate for each office to be elected. All candidates must be notified of their nomination and be willing to serve. The slate of candidates shall be presented to the Church Council prior to the election. Additional candidates may be nominated by a voting member in the voter's meeting during which the election is held provided that the nominee meets requirements above and accepts the nomination in person or in writing.

Officers, Board Chairpersons and Elders shall be elected by ballot at a regular voter's meeting. A majority of all votes cast shall be required for election. A vacated office will be filled by a communicant member 18 years of age or older, appointed by the Church Council for the duration of the term." There are two areas I want to call your attention to. First, nominations for the various positions can be made during the May Voter's meeting. However, remember the following as outlined in the constitution:

"Additional candidates may be nominated by a voting member in the voter's meeting during which the election is held provided that the nominee meets requirements above and accepts the nomination in person or in writing."

Secondly, if a position is left vacant, it "will be filled by a communicant member 18 years of age or older, appointed by the Church Council for the duration of the term." Of course no one will be appointed without their consent. However, the decision will be made by Council and not the majority of voting members from the congregation to fill these positions.

The next Council meeting is 5/9/16. The slate of candidates will be approved for the 5/15/16 Voter's Meeting. This slate will then be sent to all members prior to the 5/15/16 to allow them to review the slate in advance of the meeting. My prayer is this slate will not have any empty positions due to the lack of a candidate. May the Lord continue to bless us with the people He has led to fill these important positions in His mission field at GSLC.

By participating in this simple effort, the important message about God's love rings loud and strong!
