Stewardship Corner - Generational Stewardship of the Gospel*

[Food for thought for each of us being in our own unique time, place and circumstance.]

At a recent LCMS District Stewardship Leaders Conference a wonderful presentation was given by Hadyn Shaw based largely on his recent book, Generational IQ: Christianity isn't Dying, Millennials Aren't the Problem And the Future is Bright.

What was most enlightening in the presentation was the fact that this is the first time in human history that we have five generations living and active at the same time: Traditionalists (born before 1945), Baby Boomers (born 1946-1964), Generation X (born 1965-1980), Millennials (born 1981-2001) and Generation Z (born after 2001). As a result of their unique experiences based on the era of their birth, each demographic has strengths and temptations. No generation is like the one before it. [...]each generation tends only to see the flaws in the other generations, especially in the generation that immediately follows it.

This can serve as a tremendous frustration for those in the parish. Since each generation is unique, no one approach to ministry will be effective across the board. The many unique and varied characteristics of each of the generations of our society, and also our congregations, should not be unexpected or a source of consternation.

In fact, when one views the Biblical image of the way that the body is made up of many members and are yet one body, this should actually be a welcome concept for us to embrace. As St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ" (1 COR. 12:12).

The various strengths of the generations that Shaw cites in his book really serve as some great assets to the congregation. The stewardship challenge which is before the Church is to find a way to faithfully use these generational blessings in service to the Gospel.

Generational stewardship is about so much more than having enough money to keep the church semi-filled, heated and open to do the funerals of the Traditionalists and Boomers. It is about stewardship of the Gospel to the generations that follow. This is our task.






Servant Alert!
